Position Overview

We are seeking a compassionate and motivated Physician Assistant (PA) to join our Radiation Oncology team in Las Vegas, Nevada. This part-time opportunity offers a flexible schedule of 2–5 days per week in an outpatient oncology setting.

The PA will work closely with our Radiation Oncologists and multidisciplinary clinical team to provide high-quality, patient-centered care throughout the radiation therapy journey—from initial consultation and active treatment through follow-up and survivorship care.

This position is ideal for an experienced oncology PA or a clinically strong PA interested in developing expertise in Radiation Oncology.

Key Responsibilities

- Perform comprehensive patient histories, physical examinations, and clinical assessments.
- Conduct new-patient, established-patient, and post-treatment follow-up visits in collaboration with the Radiation Oncologist.
- Evaluate patients during their course of radiation therapy and assist with management of treatment-related symptoms and toxicities.
- Assess and manage common radiation-related side effects, including fatigue, radiation dermatitis, pain, nausea, mucositis, gastrointestinal symptoms, and other site-specific toxicities.
- Order and review laboratory studies, imaging, and other diagnostic testing as clinically appropriate and within authorized scope of practice.
- Prescribe medications and supportive therapies as permitted by Nevada law, applicable credentials, and practice protocols.
- Provide patient and family education regarding radiation therapy, anticipated side effects, symptom management, medications, and follow-up care.
- Participate in post-treatment surveillance and survivorship care.
- Identify changes in patient condition and collaborate promptly with the Radiation Oncologist regarding patients requiring physician evaluation or intervention.

- Coordinate patient care with Medical Oncology, Surgical Oncology, Primary Care, nursing, radiation therapists, dosimetry, medical physics, nutrition, palliative care, and other specialists.
- Review patient records, pathology, imaging, and relevant treatment history to support efficient clinical decision-making.
- Complete accurate and timely documentation in the electronic medical record.
- Assist with clinical procedures appropriate to the PA's training, competency, privileges, and scope of practice.
- Participate in multidisciplinary tumor boards, quality initiatives, and practice development as appropriate.

Qualifications

- Graduate of an accredited Physician Assistant program.
- Current NCCPA certification.
- Current Nevada Physician Assistant license or eligibility to obtain Nevada licensure.
- Current BLS certification.
- DEA registration and applicable prescribing credentials, as required for assigned responsibilities.
- Prior experience in Radiation Oncology, Medical Oncology, Hematology/Oncology, Surgical Oncology, or another relevant specialty is preferred.
- Candidates without Radiation Oncology experience may be considered based on overall clinical experience and interest in oncology.
- Strong clinical assessment, communication, and documentation skills.
- Ability to provide compassionate care to patients and families navigating a cancer diagnosis.
